POLYURA SEMPRONIUS BIOLOGY IN QUEENSLAND, AUSTRALIA (LEPIDOPTERA: NYMPHALIDAE)

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The Australian charaxine, Polyura sempronius (Fabricius), occurs in much of eastern Australia. It was formerly considered a subspecies of P. pyrrhus (Linnaeus). The photos show the transformation to the adult. Larvae were reared in Cardwell (near Cairns and Townsville), on the eastern Queensland coast. This Polyura in Australia is a generalist feeder on wattles (Acacia, Leguminosae) and other legumes, and several other kinds of plants are often utilized, such as camphor (Cinnamomum camphora, Lauraceae) and flame tree (Brachychiton acerifolium, Sterculiaceae), according to Common and Waterhouse (1972. Butterflies of Australia).



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
