Although ithomiine butterflies are addicted to the nectars of various flowers, many of these phantom-like butterflies seem to enjoy over-ripe, fermenting fruits. In the photographs, ithomiines are feeding on fragments of fruit from a *Ficus* tree. The fragments had fallen from the forest canopy onto leaves of lower story plants. The fruit originally was nibbled on by canopy-dwelling birds.
